### What You Need to Know to Get Started

Poster Art should illustrate how kids use computers to access the Internet safely. Create original artwork that demonstrates one of the following concepts:

- Kids behaving nicely with others and not being a bully on the Internet;
- Not giving out personal information on the Internet;
- Only visiting safe websites;
- Being careful with email (not sending worms and viruses); and
- Being careful not to download malicious code from games or websites.

### Topics

Choose from one of the following suggested topics:

1. Cyber Security
2. Cyber Bullying
3. Cyber Community Citizenship (Cyber Ethics)
4. Malicious Code (Worms and Viruses)

### Technical Specifications

#### Format

- Hand drawn artwork is requested; no electronically created submissions will be accepted. Text should be dark and large enough to read.

#### Layout

- Landscape

#### Dimensions

- Minimum – 11” wide X 8.5 “ high
- Maximum – 17” wide X 11” high

#### Content

- DO NOT send any artwork that contains trademarked images such as Disney characters, etc.



**WHO can participate?**

- The Contest is open to all Delaware 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students.
- Schools will select the best poster from their entire 4th grade class, and their entire 5th grade class as every elementary school may submit only 1 entry from each 4th and 5th grade class.

**WHAT are the judges looking for?**

- School Entry Forms and Poster Art will be judged by members of the *Kids Safe Online* Committee based on the following criteria: creativity, originality, poster concept and adherence to the poster topics and technical specifications (located on the back page).
- Each Poster Art entry must be accompanied by a completed School Entry Form.

**WHEN is the deadline?**

- School Entry Forms and Poster Art entries must be received via US Mail or other courier no later than 4:30 p.m. Friday, January 18, 2008. Late Entries will not be included in the contest but will receive a certificate of completion.
