Data Mining on the Web

A person's identity profile is very similar to a jigsaw puzzle. Each piece in the puzzle is a piece of information about that person. The puzzle pieces come from a wide array of personal information databases created and maintained by educational, commercial, government and hacker groups.

This talk describes some basic Google search techniques and websites that contain lots of information about individuals. You'll see examples of how these resources can be misused to create a composite picture of a person. These unintended consequences present a threat to our individual privacy.
