Governor Minner Honors IT Project Management and Proclaims “Project Management Week”

Dover – The Department of Technology and Information and the Information Resource Managers Council sponsored the Fourth Annual Delaware Technology Conference at the Dover Downs on Tuesday October 30th, 2007. A record number (over 500) of IT professionals from both the private and public sectors attended this year’s conference.

Governor Ruth Ann Minner honored Project Managers by proclaiming October 28-November 3, 2007 as Project Management Week in Delaware. “No other group has had a larger impact on Delaware’s public sector programs and projects than project managers,” said Governor Minner. “Project managers have played key roles in various noteworthy projects like the 800 Mhz radio system for our first responders and the construction of the William Roth Bridge over the C & D canal.
